The College Level Examination Program (CLEP) provides the opportunity to earn college credit by examinations. A maximum of 30 semester hours may be applied toward the Associate Degree from sources other than credit earned in college courses.

No college credit will be issued until the official credit report is received from CLEP (approximately two weeks). Testing is scheduled on an individual basis and may be arranged by contacting Kim Montague, Testing Coordinator at 989-358-7209 or at the Testing Center in VLH 122.
