- **1,611** total enrolled students 2017-18
- **57%** part-time **43%** full-time
- **53%** female **47%** male
- **93%** enrolled in two-year degree programs*

- Average age: **21**
- Financial aid: **\$3,235,534** in federal & state grant aid, **\$333,262** in institutional scholarships, and **\$2,189,478** in student loans were awarded to ACC students. (2017-18)

Residency:

- **51%** are residents of the ACC District, which is the same geographic boundaries as the Alpena Public Schools District;
- **33%** are residents of the ACC service area, which includes Alcona, Alpena, Iosco, Montmorency, and Presque Isle counties;
- **16%** are from Michigan, the United States or foreign countries.

Graduates:

- **354** graduated in 2017-18

Tuition 2018-19:

- **\$133.00** per contact hour for In-District*
- **\$210.00** per contact hour for Out-of-District (the rest of Michigan, all other states, and international)

*District rates are paid by residents of Alpena Community College District where a voter-approved property tax levy for the College is collected each year.

Costs:

- **\$4,530** average cost for in-district full-time students in tuition and fees for the 2018-19 school year. **\$10,380** total with books and living expenses included for a student living at home in-district.

Degrees:

- ACC offers over **75** programs of study. Students at ACC can earn a 1-year Certificate of Achievement, a 2-year Associate of Arts, Associate of Applied Science, Associate of Science, Associate of General Studies degree, or a 4-year Bachelor of Science degree.

- **18%** property taxes
- **40%** state appropriations
- **41%** tuition/fees
- **1%** other sources
